



Chief Justice Jean Daoud Fahed is the First President of Lebanon's Cassation Court and the President of its Supreme Judicial Council.

In 2012, at the age of just fifty-seven, he applied his thirty-three years of experience in criminal and civil matters towards leading the Lebanese judiciary as its Chief Justice.

In addition to his aforementioned position, he is the President of the High Judicial Disciplinary committee and the Chairman of the Institute of Judicial Studies. Furthermore, he serves as the Vice President of the Association of High Jurisdictions of Cassation of Countries Sharing the Use of French (AHJUCAF) and the Vice President of the Network of Francophone Judicial councils (RFCMJ).

Chief Justice Fahed has been awarded orders of merit from several nations including Officer of the French Legion of Honor, Member of the Mexican Legion of Honor, and Officer of the Hungarian Order of Merit.
